

INTERSTATE PEST CONTROL COMPACT
Marc Plaza Hotel
Milwaukee, Wisconsin
September 22, 1974

The meeting was convened at 2:30 P.M. by Chairman Phillip Alampi of New Jersey. Those in attendance are listed on the attached page.

Upon motion by Abercrombie of Ohio, seconded by Woodburn of Illinois, the Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Interstate Pest Control Compact held at Portland, Maine were approved as circulated to the membership.

Upon motion by Abercrombie of Ohio, seconded by Woodburn of Illinois, the Minutes of the Interstate Pest Control Compact Committee meeting held in Washington, D.C. February 5th were approved as circulated to the membership.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Woodburn of Illinois. The membership again emphasized the need to continually reinvest the funds in the highest possible return investments. The report, upon motion by Ball of Michigan, seconded by Dennistoun of Minnesota, was approved as presented.

Chairman Alampi presented the report of the Technical Advisory Committee as prepared by Henry Nixon, Pennsylvania, Chairman of the Committee. This report is filed with the Minutes of the meeting.

Chairman Alampi, in his report, presented the following items:

1. Under the Interstate Pest Control Compact no animal pest work is permitted.
2. There is need to determine what is keeping states from joining the Compact.
3. The continuing spread of the gypsy moth and cereal leaf beetle and what programs might have been developed had the Interstate Compact been in effect at the initial outbreak of these pests.

J. B. Grant of the NASDA office and Executive Director of the Compact presented his report, a copy of which is filed with the Minutes. Following his presentation, several other items came up for discussion:

1. How many times have the individual states been contacted? It was pointed out that the NASDA staff and the Secretary have made at least four mailings to all states.
2. The Executive Director, or someone else from the NASDA staff, has attended all Regional Plant Board meetings and the National Plant Board meeting in an effort to bring the program to the various non-member states.
3. The Executive Director did approach the Council of State Governments and did have a good reception from this group.

The problem of membership was raised and the following items were suggested:

1. Some states have a problem of protocol where the proper individual or individuals have not been contacted in appropriate order.
2. Most states are having a funding problem and this is used by some as the reason for not joining. It was pointed out that there is an installment payment approach possible (a copy of the motion relating to this provision is attached to these Minutes).

The need for a special brochure for informational purposes was discussed. Upon motion by Dennistoun of Minnesota, seconded by Cole of West Virginia, NASDA was authorized to coordinate the development of an information brochure in cooperation with other agencies and was further authorized to spend up to \$5,000.00 of Compact funds for the development of such a brochure. Motion was passed.

Illinois reported on new gypsy moth findings in that state and it was suggested that additional publicity should be provided with respect to the spread of this pest.

Considerable concern was expressed over the fact that Indiana is not a member of the Compact and thus leaves a void in the area insofar as continuity of programs is concerned.

It was pointed out that DDT has been approved for Tussock moth control in the Northwest and the question was raised as to whether or not the Compact should attempt to obtain approval of DDT for gypsy moth control. It appeared to be the concensus of the members that this is not the time to make this attempt.

There was substantial discussion of the need for a survey by the Executive Secretary's office to obtain more specific information as to why more states were not joining.

Member states were urged by President Alampi to discuss the Compact at the regional meetings of the departments that will be held during the regular NASDA meeting.

Nominations were as follows:

Gene Abercrombie, Ohio, as Chairman

There being no further nominations, the Secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Gene Abercrombie as Chairman. Approved.

William Harrelson, South Carolina for Vice President

There being no further nominations, the Secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for William Harrelson as Vice President. Approved.

Rollin Dennistoun of Minnesota for Secretary
Robert Williams of Illinois for Treasurer

There being no further nominations, the Secretary was instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for Rollin Dennistoun as Secretary and Robert Williams for Treasurer. Approved.

The Executive Committee for the coming year was approved as follows:
Gene Abercrombie, Chairman, William Harrelson, Rollin M. Dennistoun,
Robert J. Williams, Phillip Alampi, C. B. Christiansen.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
