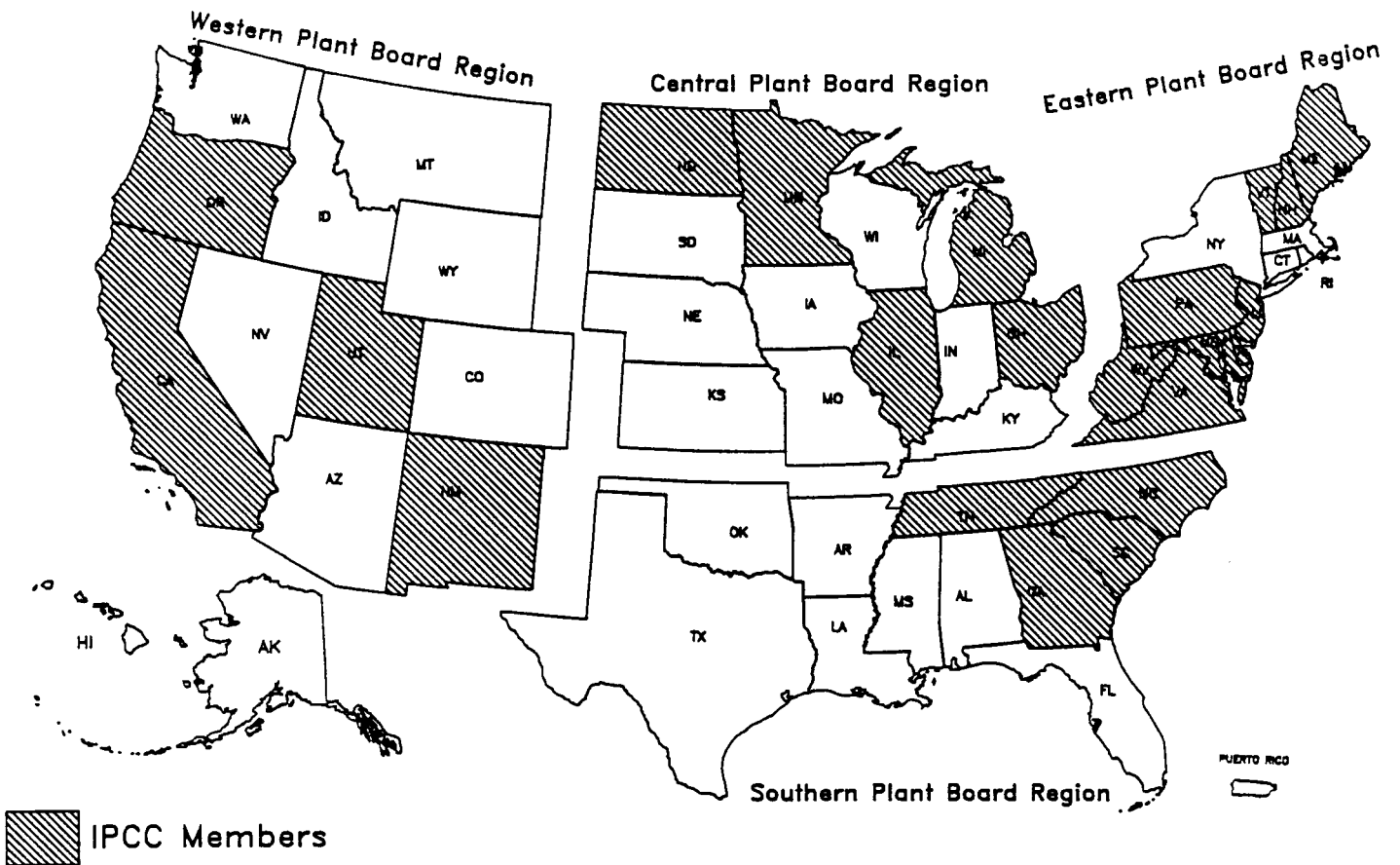

How the Fund Operates

The Compact provides that any party state can apply to the Insurance Fund for financial support of pest control or eradication activities which it wishes to have undertaken or intensified in one or more other party or, in limited circumstances, in nonparty states. When a pest is found in another state that constitutes a threat to valuable agricultural or forest crops or products within the applying state, the Insurance Fund can provide financial support for control or eradication measures. State parties to the Compact are expected to maintain their existing pest control programs at normal levels aside from any assistance from the Insurance Fund. This safeguards the soundness of the Fund and assures that it will be used to apply the additional thrust necessary to combat outbreaks, which otherwise would not be controlled.

The Insurance Fund is under the control of a Governing Board, consisting of an official representative of each party state chosen by that state in accordance with its own laws. An Executive committee, consisting of the current year officers and past chairmen, is authorized to exercise certain responsibilities for the Governing Board when the Board itself does not meet.

A Technical Advisory Committee has been established to assist the Governing Board with the technical information necessary to make a decision on whether or not the Compact should be invoked on any particular requests.

The Technical Advisory Committee is composed of two state plant control officials from each of the four regions of NASDA, selected by the Regional Plant Boards, together with a representative of the U.S. Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service and a representative of the U.S. Forest Service.

When a request is filed for invoking the Compact, the request is referred to the ten-member Technical Advisory Committee, which makes a study of the request and a recommendation on the feasibility of the project to the Governing Board. In an emergency, the Committee could make this recommendation within 72 hours or less after receiving the initial request for Compact assistance. 1992 Activities

During the year no new states became members of the IPCC; however, Compact funds were requested and approved for use in Georgia and Texas.

The Compact provided financial support to the Georgia Forestry Commission for treatment of Gypsy Moth in northwest Georgia. This isolated infestation represented a serious threat to North Carolina, Tennessee, Alabama, South Carolina and Florida. Decisive action prevented the establishment of this pest in the southeastern United States.

The Compact also provided financial support to Texas for the Africanized Honey Bee (AHB) program. The Texas certification program will help assure other states receiving honey bees from Texas that the colonies contain European honey bees.

The IPCC Governing Board appointed a Revitalization Committee to stimulate the interest of the states to join the Compact. The committee met in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, February 14, 1992, and again July 27, 1992, during the National Plant Board meeting in Portland, Maine. Issues discussed included updating the IPCC brochure, improve earnings of the Compact, hiring a consultant to recruit non-member states and developing IPCC promotional materials.

Chairman Miles "Cap" Ferry (Utah) convened the meeting at 4:30 p.m. Ferry explained the purpose of the Interstate Pest Control Compact and asked Commissioner Tommy Irvin (Georgia) to expand on his remarks. Irvin said the Compact has been designed to serve people in need of pest protection from adjoining states. Irvin also maintained that states which require assistance should bring their particular situation to the attention of the Compact. Ferry said the Compact currently has approximately \$1 million in its insurance fund and that the money was there to be used by deserving states.

Commissioner Jim Graham (North Carolina) said previously there was not enough money in the insurance fund to assist states with gypsy moth problems, but the present amount is adequate for gypsy moth eradication.

Item: Approval of Agenda.

Motion: To approve the agenda as presented was made and passed.

IPCC Secretary Burton Cardwell (Michigan) gave the minutes of the 1990 Annual Meeting in Richmond, Virginia. Minutes of the meeting were previously mailed to all member states. A copy of the minutes is contained in the Annual Report -- Interstate Pest Control Compact 1990, as prepared by NASDA Assistant Executive Secretary Robert Amato.

Motion: To approve the minutes as presented was made and passed.

Item: Treasurer's Report.

Becky Doyle (Illinois) presented the Treasurer's Report for 1991. A copy of this report and the financial statement are contained in the Annual Report -- Interstate Pest Control Compact 1991. During the report, Doyle reiterated that the insurance fund had reached \$1 million. Doyle said the fund continues to grow because of the interest accrued through investments.

Tommy Irvin then inquired as to whether or not a \$10,000 administrative fee should be paid to NASDA for its work on the compact.

At that point, Mark Tubbs (Virginia) made a motion for Virginia Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services Clinton V. Turner which reads as follows:

Motion: That a five member committee from four regional plant board geographic regions, plus one at large, be established to review current operational procedures, and recommend a course of action to revitalize the Interstate Pest Control Compact. Further, that the committee report its recommendations to all members by January 1, 1992. The motion passed.

Background

The Interstate Pest Control Compact became a reality in 1968 when five states joined the organization. Since then, another 17 states have joined for a total of 22 member states.

From 1969 to 1983, 11 requests for monies from the Compact Insurance Fund were approved. Since then, there have been no requests for Compact monies. Also, the last year that a state joined the Compact was in 1986, or five years ago.

Because of this inactivity, there needs to be a review of Compact operations with the goal of revitalizing the organization. A five member committee composed of representatives from member states located in each of the four Regional Plant Board geographic areas, plus a member at large, could handle this project.

The states suggested were Illinois, North Carolina, California, and New Jersey. The at-large member will be selected by the new IPCC chairman.

Motion: Approval of budget. Tommy Irvin moved that the budget be tentatively approved, but deferred final actions until the proposed committee confirms the appropriateness of the budget. The motion was unanimously approved.

Item: Tommy Irvin made a motion that the quorum necessary to hold the IPCC meeting should be reduced from 12 members to 8 members. The motion was unanimously approved.

Motion: By Tommy Irvin that the present Secretary and Treasurer be retained and that Pennsylvania Secretary of Agriculture Boyd Wolff be the new IPCC Chairman and South Carolina Commissioner of Agriculture Leslie Tindal be the new Vice Chairman. The motion was unanimously approved.

Motion: By Graham that nominations cease and that all individuals named before be elected by acclamation; seconded by Ferry. Motion passed. The new officers for 1991-92 are:

Motion: A motion was then made by Ferry that another meeting of the IPCC may be held in March. Seconded by Irvin (Georgia) and passed.

Motion: A motion was made by Graham (North Carolina) that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Cawley (Maryland). The motion passed unanimously. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:30 p.m. by Chairman Ferry (Utah).
